# Last Stop on Market Street Director's Notes

#### For adults:

Children's literature expert, Dr. Rudine Sims Bishop coined the phrase "Windows, Mirrors and Sliding Glass Doors" to explain how picture books provide opportunities for children to see themselves in books and how they learn about other's lived experiences. She emphasized that it is essential that children from marginalized groups to see themselves in the books they read. Similarly, it is important for BIPOC children to see themselves and learn about others in Theatre for Young Audiences.

Last Stop on Market Street is a Newberry Medal winning children's book by Matt de la Peña and illustrated by Christian Robinson. The book depicts a Black grandmother (Nana) taking her grandchild (CJ) with her on a special bus ride where they witness a microcosm of the world, and the grandchild learns some important lessons. In the stage adaptation by Cheryl West with music by Lamont Dozier and Paris Ray Dozier, the picture book springs to life centering an Afro Latino family. There is so much packed into this one hour of theatre – windows that are opened to celebrate differences, mirrors carefully placed to reflect diverse backgrounds, and sliding doors inviting audiences to experience CJ and Nana's world firsthand.

With the 50th anniversary of Hip Hop in 2023, I chose to lean into the art of hip hop theatre for inspiration. Hip Hop, the art form and culture has always been a celebration of the counternarrative – just like the flower Nana finds – it is beautiful, determined, and full of heart and soul. 50 years after artists in the Bronx, NY mixed their way into history we are still emceeing, rapping, breakdancing, and turntabling – what was first said to be a fad stood the test of time and found a place deeply rooted in storytelling highlighting the lived experience of BIPOC folks in this country. Our version of *Last Stop on Market Street* is an ode to Hip Hop set right here in Greensboro, NC. Bringing this story to life has been such a gift. We hope you will find something that reverberates and resonates, and we hope you will dance along to the Beat of Life!

# Last Stop on Market Street Director's Notes

#### For children:

Last Stop on Market Street is a picture book by Matt de la Peña and illustrated by Christian Robinson. Cheryl West and Lamont Dozier and Paris Ray Dozier turned the book into a musical play. The director of the show worked with the designers, the choreographer, the musical director, and the cast to bring the story to life. It is full of imagination and magic and the feel of hip hop – we call this kind of theatre Hip Hop Theatre. In your lifetime, we have always had rapping and breakdancing, but 50 years ago, Hip Hop was brand new! This play celebrates the birth of hip hop and its storytelling about Black people.

Seven-year-old CJ is about to take a journey with new people, new places, new sounds, new sights, and smells. Think about how you feel when you do new things. Do you feel excited? Nervous? Scared? We hope you will help CJ feel more comfortable with all these new things by singing along and dancing when the actors ask you to. It is also important to listen carefully, so you hear everything that everyone says, raps or sings.

Hear the sounds, feel the beats, and listen to the words. After the performance, let us know what you heard, what you learned, what you felt, and what you want to remember.
